- The last day of school is Thursday 28th June.



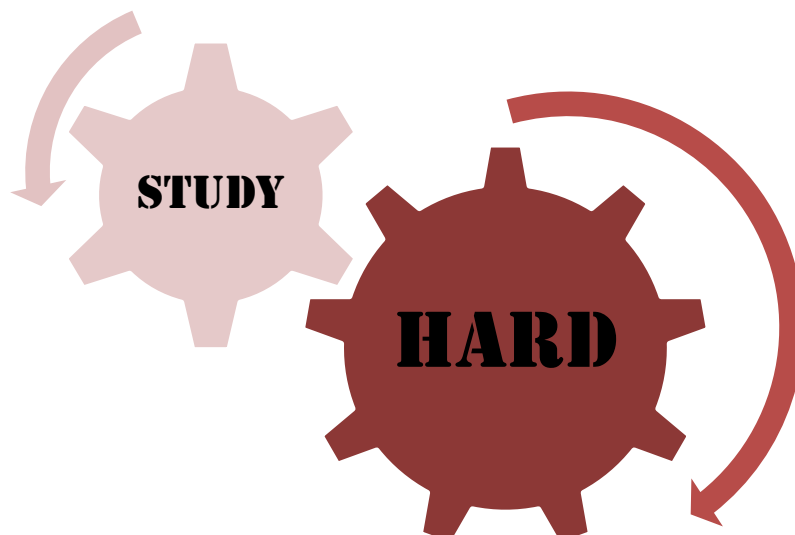

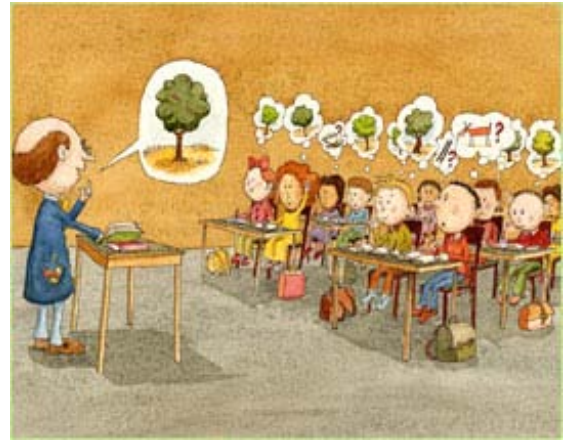

Mother Tongue Classes for 2012-2013:

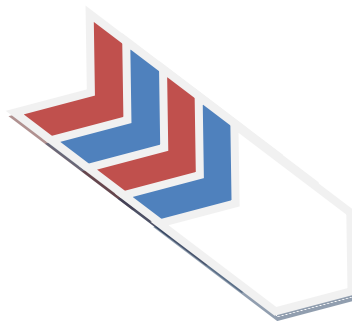

Dear Parents,

In February 2012, Qatar Academy administered the International Schools Assessment (ISA) to all students in grades 3-9. The ISA is used by schools around the world to analyze the strength of their program, to plan for improvements, and to gain information about individual students' skills. The ISA is a very valuable tool, but it does have limitations:

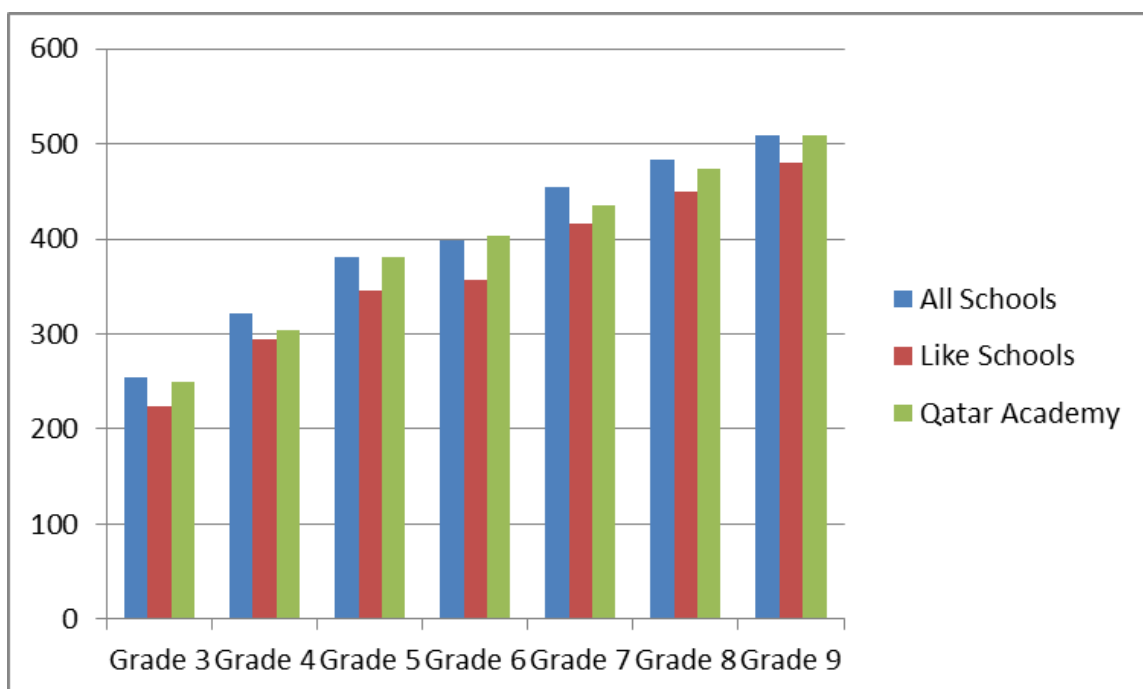
- Any child may be having a good or bad day when the ISA is given, in terms of their health and mood. This effects their results.
- The ISA is based on what schools around the world typically teach at each grade level; it is only partially aligned with QA's curriculum.

If your child took the ISA, you will receive a letter on Sunday, May 20 with your child's individual results. If you have questions about your child's results, please make an appointment through the counseling department. Tom Hazel, Head of Student Services, thazel@qf.org.qa, can assist you in this.

Each year, QA analyses its ISA results, looking at strengths and areas to improve. We then make a plan to strengthen our program. We have two main conclusions from the February 2012 ISA: Literacy continues to do well, and Mathematics is in need of additional attention, which the school is providing.

It is important that QA meet the needs of all of its learners. We have a very high percentage of students who study English as an Additional Language, so we like to check how well they are doing. When we compared our English learners to English learners from other schools, we were very excited to find that in 20 of 28 cases, QA students (green bar) on average scored higher than students in schools with similar percentages of English language learners (brown bar); in many cases, our students matched or approached schools with mainly native English speakers (blue bar).

Reading



Our main strengths were related to Literacy, where students demonstrated skills such as reading fiction and non-fiction, making conclusions based on text, and writing both narratives and exposition.

QA students were not as strong in working with visual tools such as graphs, models, shapes, tables, maps, keys, puzzles, diagrams, timetables and transformations. These skills are learned across several subject areas, and receive much attention in Mathematics lessons. Our plan to improve includes working with teachers on strategies for supporting students who have English as an Additional Language, and on strategies for teaching conceptual understanding. If you would like to assist at home, you might encourage your child to play or experiment with three dimensional models or building toys, such as Legos. They might also draw or read maps, charts or tables, or work with any visual model.

Taken overall, this data leads to the conclusion that QA students are doing well as a whole. Most grade levels, and most individual students, are doing better than their counterparts in schools with similar student populations. The data also suggests that there is room for improvement, and QA will work on improving by following the plan outlined above.

أعزائي أولياء الأمور الكرام،

خلال شهر فبراير 2012 شارك جميع طلاب أكاديمية قطر من الصف 3-9 في تقييم المدارس الدولية أو ما يسمى بـ (ISA). يهدف هذا النوع من التقييم إلى تحليل البرامج الأكاديمية والبحث في سبل تطويرها إضافة إلى كونه فرصة للتعرف على مهارات الطلاب الفردية. يعتبر هذا التقييم أداة فعالة إلا أننا نعلم أن هناك بعض العوامل الخارجية التي قد تؤثر على أداء الطالب خلال هذا التقييم :

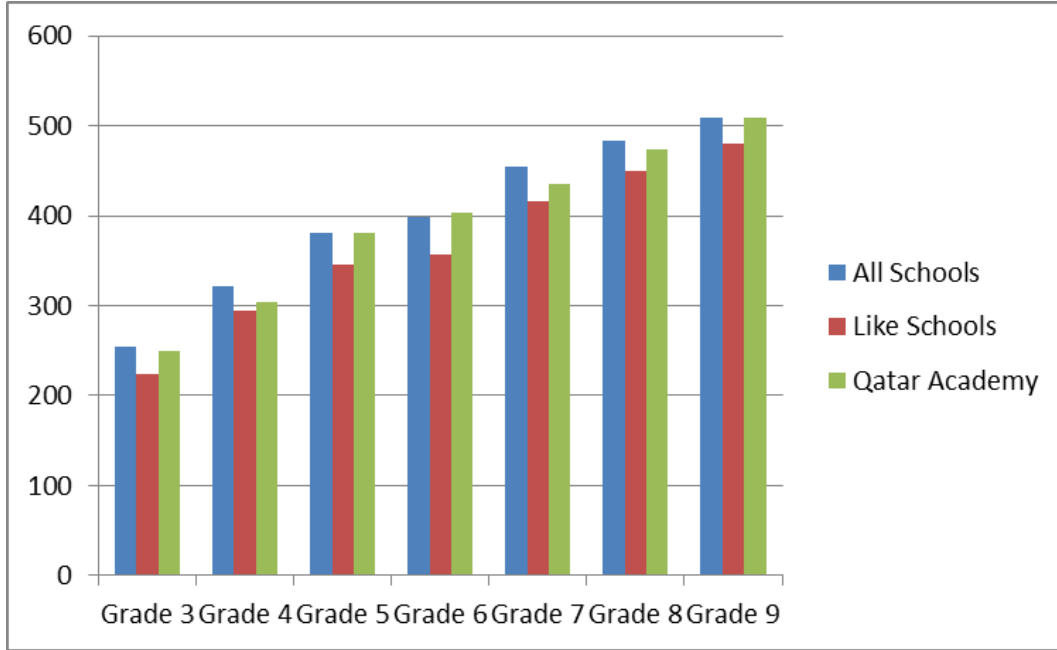
- قد يكون الطالب غير مستعد نفسياً لعمل التقييم وذلك لعدة أسباب . وهذا يؤثر بشكل مباشر على النتائج التي سيحققها.
- تُبنى أسئلة التقييم على ما يتم تدريسه دولياً في كل مرحلة دراسية بغض النظر عن نوع المدرسة. وبالتالي فإنه يتطابق فقط بشكل جزئي مع منهج أكاديمية قطر.

كما هو معروف لديكم فإن أكاديمية قطر تقوم بتحليل هذه البيانات لتحديد مواطن القوة، إضافة إلى تحديد الجوانب التي بحاجة إلى تطوير، وإعداد خطة لوضعها في عين الاعتبار. أظهرت نتائج التقييم الذي تم خلال شهر فبراير 2012 إثنان من الجوانب الهامة: استمرار وجود نتائج جيدة في جانب القراءة والكتابة وحاجة الرياضيات إلى المزيد من الاهتمام وهذا ما تم التخطيط له.

نحن في أكاديمية قطر نؤمن بأهمية تلبية الاحتياجات الخاص بجميع المتعلمين، حيث أن لدينا نسبة كبيرة من الطلاب ممن يدرسون اللغة الانجليزية كلغة إضافية . ولقد قمنا بمقارنة نتائج هؤلاء الطلاب بنتائج نظرائهم في المدارس الأخرى ووجدنا أن 20 طالب من أكاديمية قطر (اللون الأخضر) من أصل 28 طالب من مدارس أخرى (اللون البني) قد حققوا نسبة أعلى من نظرائهم في هذه المدارس. كما أظهرت البيانات تحقيق طلابنا نتائج مطابقة أو قريبة من نتائج المدارس التي بها طلاب يتحدثون اللغة الانجليزية كلغتهم الأم (اللون الأزرق).



كما أن النتائج تعكس أداء الطلاب الجيد في برامج القراءة والكتابة، حيث أظهر الطلاب قدرتهم على قراءة القصص الخيالية والغير خيالية، استنتاج الأفكار الرئيسية من النص، كتابة القصص ، والتوضيح والشرح. في الوقت نفسه لم تُظهر البيانات أداء قوي فيما يخص استخدام الوسائل البصرية مثل: الرسوم البيانية، النماذج، الأشكال، الجداول، الخرائط ومفاتيحها، تركيب الأشكال، الرسم التخطيطي، جدول الضرب، التحويل . جميع هذه المهارات يتعلمها الطالب في مواد دراسية مختلفة وأساساً في مادة الرياضيات. ولقد وضعت المدرسة خطة لتطوير هذه الجوانب تتمثل في العمل مع المعلمين من أجل وضع استراتيجيات لدعم الطلاب الذين يتعلمون اللغة الانجليزية كلغة إضافية، فضلاً عن البحث في الاستراتيجيات الفعالة لتعليم مفاهيم الرياضيات.

كما يمكنكم تقديم المساعدة في المنزل وذلك من خلال تشجيع ابنكم /ابنتكم على اللعب بالأشكال ثلاثية الأبعاد أو ألعاب البناء مثل لعبة الليجو أو رسم الخرائط والتدريب على قراءتها، إضافة إلى التدريب على استخدام الجداول البيانية أو غيرها من الوسائل البصرية من خلال اللعب.

نستنتج من خلال هذه البيانات أن طلاب أكاديمية قطر قدموا أداءً جيداً، هذا فضلاً على أن البعض منهم قد حقق نتائج تعتبر أفضل من نظرائهم في المدارس الأخرى . كما أن البيانات تظهر أن هناك جوانب بحاجة إلى تطوير والتي قمنا بأخذها في عين الاعتبار وعملنا على تحسينها كما هو موضح أعلاه.

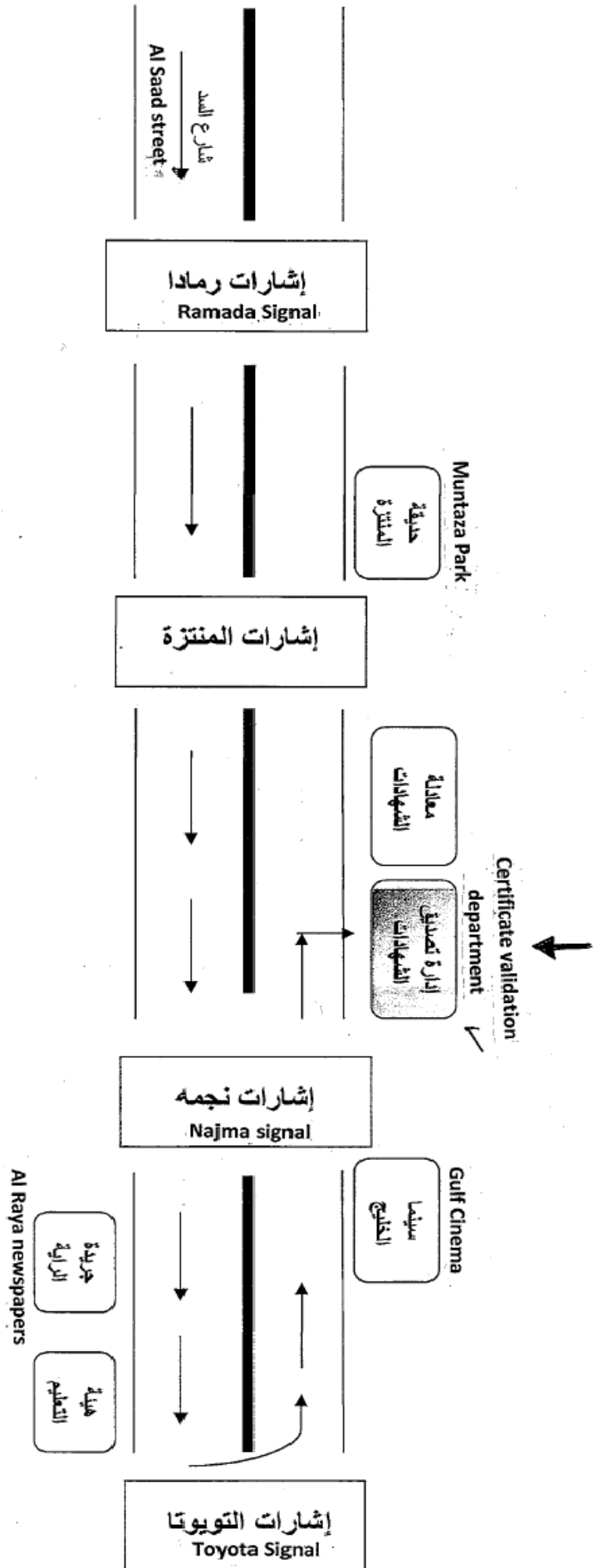
- All Diplomas will be sent to QF to be stamped.

QA senior Physical Education Swimming unit 2012

Important information for the Swimming Unit **All Grade 6-9 students**

The Swimming unit will be starting the week of the 22nd April 2021 to the end of the school year the 28th June 2011.

The aquatics unit in Physical Education is **compulsory** for **all male and female** students from grades 6-9.

All students are expected to participate throughout the unit and be actively involved in the lessons.

If, for any reason a pupil cannot swim for a lesson (a note is required), they are expected to change into their school PE kit and be enthusiastically involved on the side of the pool. Pupils will be expected to coach and assist their peers, answering questions and overall be actively involved in the learning environment.

If they do not turn up with their swimming kit or their PE kit this will be recorded as a kit mark on the register. 3 no kit (NK) for classes in term 3 PE will result in a detention.

Nearer to the start of the unit, students are required to ask their PE teacher the timetable for the Swimming unit. Each student from grades 6-9 will have 1 lesson a week in the pool for Swimming and 1 lesson a week of volleyball for 10 weeks. Grade 10 will have a slightly different timetable.

Girls Swimming Lessons

The lessons will be girls only, supported by female teaching staff and female lifeguards.

All blinds will be down, doors closed with visible girls only signs and any security cameras around the pool area turned off. Males will never enter the swimming pool area when a lesson is on.

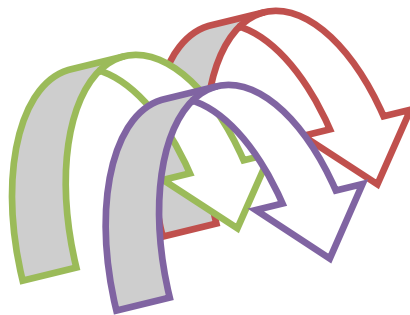
Sports Awards 2011/12 Season Date Change Now on Monday 28 May
